Gift Return

What gift might you bring Jesus not just this holiday season ahead but day after day in 2025?

Isn't it interesting how simply God presented His gift to the world? Luke 2:7 tells us, And she [Mary] gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

As with so many things about Jesus, those who waited on the promised Messiah would be underwhelmed by a birth so remarkably plain. Sounds like something we might say about one of our family members: "I'm told my great-grandfather was born in the barn because there had been a recent fire in the farmhouse."

First to come to Jesus were the shepherds moved by an angel of the Lord: "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." [Luke 2:11-12]

Dear St. John Family,

Jim and I would like to thank you for your many prayers over the past several months and update you on his current status. His stem cell transplant was on Sept. 24 and he was hospitalized for two weeks following the transplant at Huntsman Cancer Institute. He experienced pretty much all the effects of the chemotherapy and no immune system, as well as some complications, and was quite ill for some time.

He recovered to the point we could return to Idaho Falls at the end of October. He still has quite a bit of recovery that needs to happen. His bone marrow and his immune system are all brand new—essentially like that of a newborn. His ability to fight and prevent infections are quite limited and his blood cell counts are very, very slowly increasing. But they are increasing and we're so very thankful!! He does have to restrict his exposure to crowds and large groups of people for a while, especially since we're now in the midst of cold & flu season.

Please continue to pray for his ongoing recovery and for his new bone marrow to develop and grow all the new blood cells his body needs. Words cannot sufficiently express our gratitude for your love, support, prayers and messages during this journey, as well as the love & support and prayers for our family! ~ Ann & Jim W.
