<u>loving Beyond the Facade</u>

In worship recently we discussed that Small office@stiohnministries.net Groups for the Red Letter Challenge give us the opportunity to be in community in which brothers and sisters in Christ may share themselves more deeply so that there is opportunity for needed and mutual prayer, support, encouragement and celebration.

Consider this prayer by Martin Luther:

Behold, Lord, an empty vessel that needs to be filled. My Lord, fill it. I am weak in faith: strengthen me. I am cold in love: warm me and make me fervent, that my love may go out to my neighbor.

I do not have a strong and firm faith; at times I doubt and am unable to trust you altogether.

O Lord, help me. Strengthen my faith and trust in you.

I have sealed the treasures of all I have in you.

I am poor; you are rich, and you came to be merciful to the poor. I am a sinner; you alone are true. In me there is an abundance of sin: in you is the fullness of righteousness. Therefore, I will remain with you, from whom I can receive. but to whom I may not give. Amen.

Before God. Luther removes the mask or facade that all of us are prone to wear. When we are enabled by God to gather together in Jesus' name and share the harder things of our personal lives, our Small Groups may become safe places that attract those who are

open to learning more about Jesus and how he works among and through his followers.

Luther's prayer puts to words his complete dependence upon the Lord as the needed source for all the reformer lacks. As a believer. Luther shares his daily, deep need for God.



May God fill us with the desire to be His authentic people in small groups of believers that are wide open to other needy sinners to join and grow to know the great love of Jesus.

Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim.

John 2:6-7

Just as Jesus had the water jars filled in the miracle of Cana, he still fills his people today.
